



#### **Confirmation of Number of Months Cumulated in Graduate Studies Form**

# Section 1 and 2 of this form must be completed by <u>all</u> candidates submitting an application to the CIHR Doctoral Research Award competition. The information will be used by CIHR to calculate the number of months an applicant has cumulated in graduate studies and assess their eligibility.

As of October 1<sup>st</sup> of the competition deadline year, all candidates must have completed a **minimum** of 12 months of graduate study at the Master's or doctoral level. In addition, the table below outlines the **maximum** amount of time a candidate can be registered as a full-time student in a doctoral program, in order to be eligible to apply  $1 \ge 3$  (note that this includes all previous studies at the graduate level, regardless of discipline, either course-based or research-based). For more information on eligibility requirements, please refer to the Funding Opportunity.

holds a Master's degree or has completed 12 months or more in a Master's degree program prior to transferring to or starting a doctoral program	22 months
has completed less than 12 months in a Master's degree program prior to transferring to or starting a doctoral program	30 months
has transferred directly from a Bachelor's degree to a doctoral program (with no time in a Master's program)	34 months

<sup>1</sup> Two sessions of part-time study is counted as one session of full-time study. A full-time session is counted as 4 months of studies, unless otherwise noted on the official transcripts.

<sup>2</sup> If an applicant registered in a master's degree program and subsequently transferred to a doctoral degree program (fast-tracked), the months in the doctoral program will be calculated starting from the first session in which the applicant officially transferred to the doctoral program.

<sup>3</sup>If registered in a combined undergraduate and doctoral program (e.g., MD/PhD), any part-time periods must be specified. This calculation must be consistent with the transcripts provided. For eligibility purposes, the MD portion will not count towards the number of months at the doctoral level.

#### Appendix

The table below provides an example of a candidate registered in a combined MD/PhD program which started in the 2016 winter term.
